
Codes: -

"Right now, I'm still trying to resolve a complaint with the Equal Opportunities Commission over how many minorities I'm supposed to hire.




"The IRS has seized all my assets, claiming that I'm trying to leave the country, and I just got a notice from the state that I owe some kind of use tax.

"You mean you're not going to destroy the world?"






Why not war?




Chatterbooks




